



MASONIC KITCHEN

In the late 18th century, the Williamsburg branch of the Masons rented the ground floor of a house on Francis Street owned by William Lightfoot for their Lodge. The Masonic Kitchen, which is shown on the 1782 Frenchman's Map of Williamsburg, is next to the Masonic Lodge. Eighteenth-century kitchens were detached from the main house to prevent the spread of food odors and extreme heat and to reduce the risk of fire.

The first floor has a living area and a master bedroom with a queen canopy bed. The second floor has twin beds. The full bath facilities are located on the second floor.
