



NICHOLAS-TYLER OFFICE

The Nicholas-Tyler Office is located on the corner of East Francis Street and South England Street. Robert Carter Nicholas owned the property in 1770. He built a large house with numerous dependencies. John Tyler, the 10th president of the United States, owned the property and, as vice-president, received word at the house that William Henry Harrison lay dead at the White House.

There are two suites in this house. The first floor has a sitting room with a fireplace. The bedroom has two double beds. There is a private, full bath. The second floor has a double bed and a raised sitting room area with a day bed. There is a private, full bath. These two rooms have separate entrances, but a connecting door joins both rooms without going outside.
